The Rotary Club of Pune Baner conducted two epilepsy surgeries in August 2023 under its signature medical project. The surgeries were conducted at the Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital and Research Centre Pune, by Dr. Nilesh Kurwale, an epilepsy surgeon. The Club conducts free epilepsy surgeries for needy patients of all ages under an MOU with Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital and Research Centre. The project was conceptualized in the year 2021-22 by PP Rtn. Sanket Saraf and team.

Rtn. Sanket writes a small note after visiting a patient, a ten year old girl in the month of August. The note goes thus -

"Yesterday we met the 10 year old Ishmita from Delhi, who was successfully operated for epilepsy. We also met her parents from at Deenanath Mangeshkar Hospital. Thank you to President Jigneash, IPP Kabraji. In frame is seen Dr Sujit and administrator Nilam from DMH. Ishmita is the 10th patient under our club's agreement with DMH. This year we have financially supported 3 patients in July and 2 in August. In September also we are planning a few surgeries subject to healthy donations."

RCPB conducts these epilepsy surgeries year after year and has a plan to reach 50 such free surgeries in the coming two years. These special operations bring a relief to the aggrieved patients and their families as the condition of epilepsy is completely cured after these surgeries. The patients get a new lease of life and they start living life with a renewed zest.
