Operation Cactus: Indian Intervention in Maldives - Nov 1988

A Story of Airborne Assault in Maldives by Indian Armed Forces

Group Capt A G Bewoor was commissioned into the IAF in Oct 1965 and took premature retirement after 28 years service, in December 1993 and settled in Pune. He has flown more than 5000 hrs on 11 types of aircraft. He was one of the 12 pilots selected for training in the USSR on the giant IL-76.

He commanded 44 Sqn at Agra for two years and personally led the airborne assault into Maldives by landing the first IL-76 on an unlit runway at night without any friendly forces on the ground. He was awarded the Vayu Sena Medal for Gallantry by the Rashtrapati in 1990.

After retiring from the IAF, he worked with Onward Technologies in Pune for 22 years. He writes regularly for journals, magazines, on-line portals on both military and other subjects.

We have an SOS for immediate help, on a tenuous satellite phone from their tourism minister's house. We are trying to hustle the NSG (National Security Guard) for this task, but can the army help?"

"Of course we can help, Ronen. We will start working on it right away. You better hold onto that communication channel all day. When can we brief the PM at the Operations Room?" (ops room)

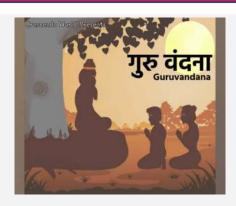
lives.

ARTIFICIAL LIMBS PROVISION TO THE NEEDY-AN INITIATIVE BY INNER WHEEL CLUB OF PUNE

Bharat Vikas Parishad Vikalang Punarvasan Kendra is a nationwide organization and it is working for people with disabilities. They make artificial limbs, both legs and hands in their own workshop with the help of advanced machinery and trained technicians.

They have 13 permanent disability centres at present. The centre in Pune is has been functioning since 1997 and has provided around 2000 limbs free of cost to handicapped people who cannot afford it.

They hold camps in various places to identify the needy patients and call them to Pune for fitting of the limbs. Everything is done scientifically. These advanced modular feet are light in weight, durable and foldable at knee joints. These people can then walk, swim jump drive and run.

All the personnel working there are doing it for free as a service to nation. The original organization is dedicated for educational, social, moral and cultural development of the society.

Inner wheel club of Pune sponsored limbs for Six patients. I attended the project and was very touched and impressed with their work.

Now our Rotary club is also doing this project on **20th September.** Details will be shared by Community Director Zarir Dadachanji. Please attend in large numbers and get enlightened.
