Today, our third meeting of the new Rotary Year with <u>Air Marshal</u> (Retd.) Shirish Baban Deo <u>PVSM</u>, <u>AVSM</u>, <u>VM</u>, <u>VSM</u>, <u>ADC</u> was the <u>Vice Chief of the Air Staff</u> (VCAS) of the Indian Air Force. He will talk on "Traitors and Treason in Indian context".



He assumed the office of Vice Chief on 31 December 2016 served in the same capacity till his retirement on 30 September 2018.

Air Marshal Deo was born in <u>Nagpur</u>, <u>Maharashtra</u> and is an alumnus of <u>Defence Services Staff College</u>, <u>Wellington</u>.

Air Marshal Deo was commissioned into the fighter stream of the Indian Air Force on 15 June 1979. He has clocked more than 4000 hours of operational and training flying experience. He held several key operational and administrative appointments at

various stages of his service including Fighter Combat Leader; A2 qualified instructor and Directing Staff at TACDE; Chief Operations Officer of a front-line forward base; Commanding Officer of Air Force Station Jodhpur; Director General Air Operations at Air Headquarters; Air Officer Commanding of COBRA Group; AD Commander; Air-I at Headquarters; Central Air Command; Air Officer Commanding in Chief of Eastern Air Command and Air Officer Commanding in Chief of Chief of Chief of Western Air Command.

Air Marshal Deo has been awarded several medals: the <u>Param Vishisht Seva Medal</u>, the <u>Ati Vishisht Seva Medal</u>, the <u>Vishisht Seva Medal</u>, and the <u>Vayu Sena Medal</u>. He was also appointed as Honorary <u>ADC</u> to the <u>President of India</u> on 1 January 2016.

Air Marshal Deo is married to Mrs. Anjna Deo and they have a son, Karan Deo, who is a squadron leader in the <u>Indian Air Force</u>. His younger brother, Justice Rohit Deo, is elevated as a Judge of the Bombay High Court on 5 June 2017.



GG2122528 - RCPC Pediatric Cardiac Surgery and Maternal Health Project - 'Virtual Gift of Life' ceremony

You would recall that we had undertaken a **global grant funded project (GG2122528) to carry out pediatric congenital heart disease corrective surgeries at the Sri Sathya Sai Sanjeevani Hospital, Kharghar.** The Rotary Club of Fort Wayne, USA is the overseas partner club in this project which is intended to give a new life to 40 children afflicted with congenital heart disease. The beneficiary children belong to the economically weaker sections of society.

The primary objective of the project was to sponsor Pediatric Cardiac surgery for children born with Congenital Heart Disease (CHD) and provide Ante-Natal Care for maternal health and nutrition to pregnant women to prevent the occurrence of CHD. The project addresses the treatment and prevention of one of the major causes of infant mortality in India.



The project has benefited children from the economically weaker sections of society suffering from CHD, who do not have access to adequate medical facilities and also cannot afford the expensive surgery. It also benefits pregnant women who do not have access to proper Ante-Natal care and do not get proper nutrition.

The hospital provides Paediatric Cardiac surgery at a negotiated fixed price of Rs 1,50,000 which includes preoperative test, post-operative care (in ICU if required), and follow up visits. It also covers the cost of hospital stay and food for the parents accompanying the children. The entire cost is funded from donations. The beneficiaries do not have to pay for the treatment.

The project caters to all types of paediatric cardiac operations and Catheter interventions like ASD / VSD / PDS device closures, PAPVC, Intra Cardiac Repair for TOF, Aortic Valve Repair, AV Canal Repair, Arterial Switch and balloon dilations.

Total Project cost of this Global Grant is USD 98,000 (INR 71 Lakhs)

Total Beneficiaries of this project is about 40 children and 230 pregnant women.

Most of the surgeries having been completed, the hospital arranged a 'Virtual Gift of Life' ceremony with some of the children (and their parents) who have benefited from this project.

Besides a virtual tour of the hospital and its facilities, the program also included interactions with the Chairman and one of the Trustees of the institution, the medical team and the hospital management team.

Rotary: global home for LGBT members and friends

During a breakout session on "Welcoming the LGBTQ Community in to the Family of Rotary" during the 2017 Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, Michelle Wilson, a member of the Rotary Club of Athens Sunrise, Ohio, had a question. "I asked, 'Why doesn't Rotary have a group for LGBT+ people?" When she added, "We should start one," she says, "the response was overwhelming."

Before the session had even ended, Sean O'Hara, a member of the Rotary Club of Lake Charles Happy Hour, Louisiana (and later the fellowship's first president), had opened a Facebook group for LGBT people (lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender). Wilson left the meeting with a stack of business cards from people who wanted to be part of the new group. The LGBT Rotarians and Friends Fellowship was born.

In between regular Zoom events held in English, Spanish, and Portuguese, members like Wilson — who is the group's current president — are talking to clubs about promoting diversity and telling the story of being LGBT in Rotary.

The fellowship is seeking to work with clubs on projects that support the LGBT community and to offer resources to clubs that want to be more diverse and welcoming to all.
