# TODAY

Guest Speaker, Mr. Abhijit Dhondphale, Sculptor will talk on "The Sculptor and his Sculpture" on Saturday, March 9, 2024, at the Poona Club Conference Hall 1.



Founded in 1941 by Mr. Naresh Dhondphale, a freedom fighter and subsequently led by his sons Ravindra and Anil, Dhodphale, Kala Niketan (DKN) embarked on its journey with the creation of Lord Ganapati idols for Pune's Ganapati festival. Today, under the guidance of Mr. Abhijit Dhondphale, the third-generation artist and grandson of the founder, DKN stands as a unique art studio known for its emphasis on quality over quantity.

DKN has made significant strides in the art world, utilizing innovative materials such as environmentally friendly paper pulp, epoxy resin, and imitation marble. Notably, Mr. Abhijit Dhondphale was recognized by Prime Minister Shree Narendra Modi in "Mann Ki

Baat" for his contribution to the Eco-Friendly Ganapati Movement.

In April 2023, Mr. Dhondphale received a patent for an Eco-Friendly Water Dissolvable and Strong Mixture for Sculptures and Idols, a groundbreaking achievement in the field.

Apart from his artistic endeavors, Mr. Dhondphale is actively involved in spreading knowledge through free "Saturday Sessions," talk shows at renowned institutions, and notable awards such as the "Shilpagaurav Puraskar," "Naipunya Ganesh Puraskar," and the "Atal Sadhana Puraskar" in 2023.

Among his remarkable sculptures are life-size bronze statues of historical figures like Chatrapati Shri Shivaji Maharaj, Field Marshal S.H.F.J. Sam Manekshaw, General Rajinder Singh Ji Maharaj, and more. Additionally, Mr. Dhondphale has created numerous bronze busts and murals, showcasing his artistic prowess.

We believe that this opportunity is ideal, and we are committed to putting forth our best efforts to delight you with our artistic creations.

The venue for this enlightening session is Poona Club Conference Hall 1, with the program commencing at 6:30 p.m. Following the meeting, Happy Hours dinner, graciously hosted by Rtn. Giri Sakhrani.

home only after 5 pm. Here is a college that needs to be nurtured and provided as much support as possible through large CRS funding. It will have to be carried forward in the years to come.

Last Saturday was an unique experience; seeing the result of our major CSR Project. Rtn Payal Rajpal, of ROBOTEX India, is steering this project, and it was wonderful to see the children from very humble backgrounds creating Robots, and confidently displaying them. These children had been to Tallin, Estonia, to participate in the International Robotics Competition, and were on the podium for their projects. It is indeed heartening to see how the needy are being benefitted.

Preparations are underway for the Cricket Match between the Maharashtra and Mumbai Wheelchair Cricket Teams on Sunday, 10 March, at the Poona Club Cricket Ground. ## The Week That Was

#### **Young Einsteins**

Members were fascinated by a group of students from Pune's B.T. Shahani School, who gave us a glimpse of their innovative talents and the remarkable achievements of RCPC's Robotics Project, headed by RCPC member Rtn. Payal Rajpal. She recounted how she had surmounted several hurdles such as overcoming parental objections/concerns, and obtaining passports and visas at the last minute for the children selected to represent India at an international robotics competition in Tallinn, Estonia, where they made it to the top ten. The children had also scored third place at Robotex Asia in 2017.

Rtn. Payal stressed the importance of digital literacy "for a better tomorrow", adding that nearly 1.2 million children across the country are now being groomed in robotics, Artificial Intelligence, and STEM (science, technology, engineering and mathematics) coding, which have become the foundation of education and innovation around the world. Some of the inventions demonstrated by the Young Einsteins from Pune included:

- a river-cleaning boat equipped with technology to gather submerged and floating debris
- a mountain safety device that detects vehicles in mountainous terrain with real-time monitoring of vehicle speed, whilst displaying critical information to promote safe driving

 a four-layer authentication system for vehicles, covering face recognition, fingerprint identification, password/personal identification number, and a global positioning system (GPS) and global system for mobile communications (GSM).

At the end of the meeting several Rotarians and Rotarians commented that thanks to these bright youngsters, India's future is in safe hands.

Earlier in the evening, Rtn. PP Prakash Gurbaxani gave us an entertaining summary of his year in office (2000–2001), during which his aim was "to do things differently". The presence of three doctors and four accountants on his board of directors, ensured that projects undertaken throughout his tenure were in great shape. An unforeseen event like the Bhuj earthquake in Gujarat required large-scale disaster management, and RCPC rose to the occasion by sending two truckloads of relief material and following up with rehabilitation efforts for eighteen months.

Rtn. Prakash added that several new members were inducted into the club and the plethora of high-profile guest speakers included politician Sushma Swaraj and Dorab R. Sopariwala, writer and media personality. Doing things differently even when it came to vocational awards, waiters on the Deccan Queen were among the honorees recognised for their hard work. Another achievement that Rtn. Prakash looks back on with pride is that during his presidency, all club meetings ended at 8 p.m. sharp.

# Visit to New Vision Arts and Commerce College, Takali Haji, Shirur Taluka

On Monday, 04 March, a group of Rotarians – PPs Rakesh Bhargava, Jinendra Munot, Rtn. Pravin Nadkarni and self, accompanied by R'Ann Dipti visited the New Vision Arts and Commerce College at Village Takali Haji, in Shirur Taluka. This is probably the only residential college for Physically and Visually Challenged Students – both male and female. Situated about 70 km from Pune, this institution is set up by the Malganga Andh Apang Sanstha. The Director of this institution is Mrs Jaee Khamkar, a visually challenged lady (100% Blind, asw she refers to herself), who has decided to devote her life to the well-being of physically and visually challenged individuals by providing them education up to graduate level.

The Institution had requested for help to set up science laboratories so that science stream students can also be admitted. Three of our senior members, Past Presidents Rakesh Bhargava and Jinendra Munot, and Rtn. Amita Munot had committed to pay Rs 50,000/- each towards this project. They had expressed their desire to visit the site so that they could decide on further support for the project. Towards this end this visit was planned and undertaken on the 4th of March. We also visited the new site of the college where the construction of four class rooms and a Laboratory has been completed.

Additionally, the college had requested for upgradation of their computers. They were chosen to be the beneficiaries of the last five Green PCs funded and produced by Rtn. Pravin Nadkarni. These green PCs were installed and the Computer lab inaugurated on the same day.

It was a very productive day, and we were able to understand and assess the needs of this special institution, and will be taking it further through greater funding via the CSR Route. It was very evident that this is where we really need to 'Create Hope', by doing good.






