Our own Member Rtn. Giri Sakhrani Director Non-Medical, will give us a talk on "Reliving Manali to Khardungla - Ride of a Lifetime" at weekly meeting on Saturday, April 27, 2024, at the Poona Club Conference Hall 1.



Rtn. Girdharilal Sakhrani, fondly known as Giri is the Managing Director of Ferrocare Machines Pvt Ltd. An active Rotarian since 2007, he has served as the Chair for Vocational Services for five years and served as the Director - Non-Medical Service for two terms. He has also been recognised as the Rotarian of the Year twice.

Giri is a keen cyclist and has been right up to Khardungla pass on his cycle. He is passionate about the environment; water conservation and tree plantation in particular, and has been handling projects in these areas for some years now.

Giri is loaded with a vast knowledge of most things and is physically fit for a lot of activities. He shall speak on cycle ride from Manali to Khardungla Pass 5 mountain passes. This covers a distance of 550 kms. and climbing from Manali, which is at 7000 feet to Khardungla which is a height of 18350 feet, believe me, but all this was covered by him, and others in the group, in 10 days on a CYCLE.



The venue for this enlightening session is Poona Club Conference Hall 1, with the program commencing at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be followed by a Fellowship dinner, graciously hosted by Rtn. Nandita Khaire.

Traditionally, a half-hour pre-meeting Fellowship will commence at 6:30 p.m., leading to the official start of the meeting at 7 p.m.

From the President's desk



Almost ten months of the current Rotary Year have passed, and as we close on to the magic date of 1st July, it is natural to feel pensive, as I am, writing this piece, wondering whether we have actually, "Created Hope in the World'. The fact that we set 25 goals and have already achieved 19 of them, thus qualifying for the RI President's Citation, is not what I am referring to! What I want to highlight is the fact that we ensured completion of last year's Mega Cataract Project, in which we oversaw the conduct of 10,779 Cataract Surgeries, 84 Corneal Transplants and 155 Glaucoma Surgeries. This year we had set an ambitious target of 15,000 Cataract surgeries, and I am glad

to report that with generous contribution of Rs 300,00,000/- from Desai Brothers (Rtn Nitin Desai), Rs 30,00,000/- from Volkhart India Foundation, Rs 10,00,000/- from Rtn Baakir Baker, Rs 52,50,000/- form our own club members, other clubs and \$ 50,000/- from the Sankara Eye Foundation. We are sponsoring 50 Paediatric Heart Surgeries for Children born with Cardiac Heart Disease. We have created a Maharashtra Wheelchair Cricket team, a Math Lab at a Rural school, and gifted 25 Green PCs to shools so that they can conduct computer literacy classes at their schools. Antulay Nagar, a clony inhabited by 1500 leprosy survivors has been made into a Happy Village by giving them clean usable water by cleaning up their unusable well, and now ensuring that each house has piped water supply from that well. I guess we have created hope amongst a lot of people.

This week we also got the good news that Rtn Nitin Desai, has agreed to donate a further Rs 400,00,000/- for a hospital restoration project. This will catapult him into the Arch Klumph Society Foundation Circle. Great going Nitin Bhai, heartiest congratulations and heartfelt thanks for your abundant generosity.

This week also marked the completion of the Satara Dam Repair project. The repair, and de-silting of the Dam and its catchment area at Rajapur was completed. Now we look towards the rain God to fill up the lake.

Another landmark event of the year happened on Tuesday, the 23rd of April, when the Charter Installation of the Rotaract Club of Christ University, Lavasa took place. The report is included in this Bulletin. The only sad part of the event was that the only Rotarian from our club present for the event was yours truly. It was a saving grace that Rtn Sanjay Karwa, District Co-Director of Youth Service was present.

This week we have our own member, Rtn Giri Sakhrani speaking to us about hie unforgettable bicycle ride from Manali (7000') to Khardungla (18450'), covering a distance of 550 km in 10 days. Please come and hear about it. Look forward to seeing you.

India shining



Our distinguished guest speaker, Lt. Gen. (Dr.) D. B. Shekatkar, PVSM, AVSM, VSM (Retd), gave an inspiring talk on India's role and impact in world affairs in the 21st century. "The whole world's perception of India is changing," he said, citing examples of events that have put India front and centre on the world stage, such as the mass production of vaccines during the Covid crisis, strong and steady economic growth, increasing foreign investments, and widespread empowerment of women.

He added that India's "intellectual capital" was being recognised around the world and many countries were eager to collaborate with India. One such collaboration is the proposed India–Middle East–Europe Economic Corridor, which will bolster economic development by fostering connectivity and economic integration between Asia, the Gulf countries and Europe.

Lt. Gen. Shekatkar said that another matter of pride is that Indian armed forces are currently on peacekeeping duties in 48 countries — ranging from South America to Africa and the Middle East — and there are growing requests from governments around the world for assistance from the Indian Army. "India's vibrant democracy will remain alive and will continue to thrive," he concluded. "India is now being taken seriously."
