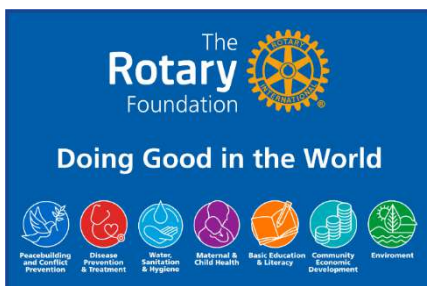
## Enriching Experiences and Impactful Initiatives: A Comprehensive Overview of Rotary Club of Poona Downtown's Activities

**Fellowships and Celebrations:** The camaraderie among our members has been further strengthened through a series of memorable fellowships and celebrations. 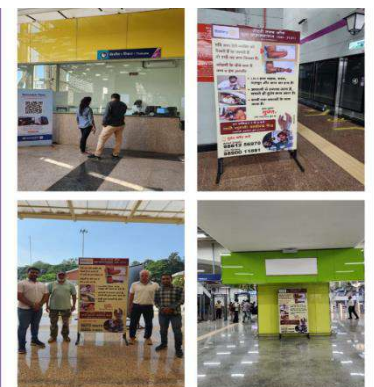
**Club Magazine "ROTALINK":** Our club magazine, "ROTALINK," continues to be a cornerstone of our communication efforts. The editorial team's dedication and talent are evident in the magazine's informative and engaging content, covering news of our Club, District, and Rotary International. "ROTALINK" serves as a valuable resource for our members, keeping them informed and connected.



**Foundation and Grants:** Director PP Yezdi Batliwala has been instrumental in driving our TRF Donations, Polio, fundraising and grant allocation efforts. As of 31st January 2024, our club has collected an impressive amount of Rs. 18,09,650 (US\$ 21814) through Annual Programs Fund (APF) and Polio contributions. Additionally, we have participated in a Radiation Centre Grant with a CSR donation of Rs.31,42,000 (US\$ 37855) from Duroshox Pvt.Ltd, donations to the Cow Donation Project of Rs. 1,05,000 (US\$1265) bring our total giving to The Rotary Foundation (TRF) for the year so far to Rs. 50,46,650 (US\$60934). We are in the process of finalizing an application for a

Global Grant titled "**RCPD- Janseva Foundation Vocational Skilling Centre**" of Rs. 47,50,000 (US\$ 57,230). We inaugurated a CSR Grant project titled "**Shri Bahri Malhotra Residential & Vocational Training Home for Girls**", with last year's AKS donation from Weikfield Foods Pvt.Ltd on 8th January 2024 at the hands Hon'ble Shri Ram Nath Kovid, former President of India. A generous donation for current District Projects of Rs. 20 lakhs towards **Pediatric Cardiac Surgery** plus Rs. 10 Lakhs towards Anganwadi Upgradation (Total Rs. 30 Lakhs) has been received from Rtn. Suresh Balani from the USA. Rtn Balani's Rotary Club has agreed to partner us as "Notional Partners" in the Pediatric Cardiac Surgery Grant project.

**Public Image Enhancement Initiatives:** Under the guidance of Public Image Director Rtn. Sujata Malkani, our club has made commendable efforts to enhance our public image and visibility. Through strategic dissemination of project write-ups and photos on various platforms such as District Chats, Rotary News, and the Governor's Monthly Letter, we have effectively showcased our club's initiatives and achievements. Initiatives like promoting tricycle shops with the Gift of Mobility Team, securing media coverage in prominent channels, placing standees at Metro Stations, displaying posters on rickshaws and organizing a blood donation camp with Mastercard have contributed significantly to raising awareness and garnering support for our projects. Our future plans involve continuing the promotion of tricycle shops, activating social media for wider reach, and seeking press coverage for major projects.

**Community Service Medical Initiatives:** Under the leadership of Director Rtn. Vinod Dua, our community service initiatives in the medical domain have made significant strides. Highlights include a successful Blood Donation Camp at MASTERCARD office that collected 634 units of blood, five LN4 Camps benefiting 228 individuals, three Eye Camps aiding 1011 beneficiaries, Distribution of Nutrition Kits to over 175 TB patients, Hepatitis Vaccinations at the Mental Hospital and the establishment of a well-equipped Dialysis Center at Khedekar Hospital. These efforts have positively impacted the lives of over 2200 individuals, underscoring our commitment to healthcare accessibility.

In the next few months, Rotary Club Pune Downtown (RCPD) plans on focusing on healthcare and mobility initiatives. These include organizing INALI Hands fitment camps in Gujarat and Rajasthan to benefit 300 individuals, distributing 25 tricycles to improve mobility and providing TB Nutrition to 200 beneficiaries starting February 2024. We are actively seeking contributions to bridge a fund deficit. Dental Checkup Camps for 800 children, Eye Camps for 500 children and Pediatric Cardiac Surgeries for 20 children are also scheduled in the coming months.

**Community Service Non-Medical Initiatives:** Under the leadership of Rtn Bageshree Gogate, RCPD embarked on numerous non-medical initiatives to support disadvantaged communities. 20 school kits were distributed to children in a local community and goody bags, board games, and floor mats were provided to children at the HOPE Daycare Centre. Laptops to 20 visually impaired students were donated at SP College and ten scholarships were established at Anjuman Islam Polytechnic - five each for computer applications and basic fashion designing.

RCPD also conducted screenings for 696 patients and distributed devices to 248 beneficiaries at the Low Vision Aid Centre. The renovation of four Anganwadis in Wagholi is going to begin soon, enhancing facilities for children and communities. Our club supported coaching classes for girls in slum areas, benefiting a total of 600 individuals, contributing to educational and social empowerment.



**Youth Services:** Director Shailendra Abhyankar has ensured that Youth Service initiatives remained active and impactful across four Interact Clubs: Sunder Ji Stars, Pujya Kasturba Gandhi School, Erin Nagarwala School and the Community-based Interact Club. Particularly noteworthy is the exceptional progress made by the Interact Club at Sunder Ji Stars, with neuro-diverse children, who have excelled in various activities including participation in the Interact District Assembly, District Conference and Upcycling Workshop. The club has been engaged in projects such as Traffic Rules Awareness, Clean Your City campaigns and Upcycling projects. Under the guidance of Rtn. Phiroze, the Erin Nagarwala Club members visited the INDIC Science Museum. In the Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE) program, both inbound student Giovanna and outbound participant Sunesh Jain are thriving. Plans are also underway to organize a RYLA tailored for special children, emphasizing inclusivity and youth empowerment.

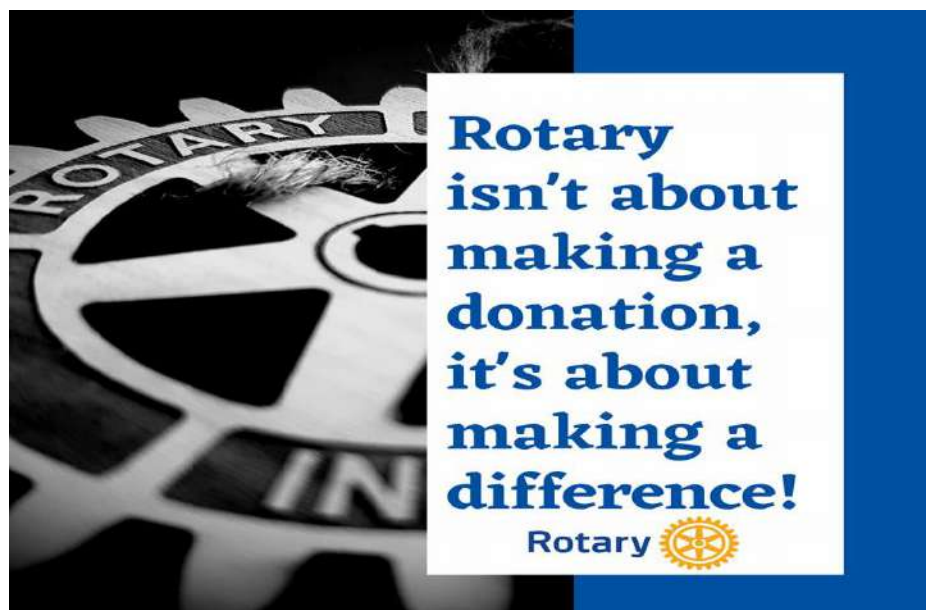
*We have also faced some hurdles and challenges on the way, but have moved on steadily – steadfast in our purpose of creating positive impact in our community.*

## Inali Prosthetic Hand Camp at Gandhidham

On the 9<sup>th</sup> of February 2024, a team comprising Pradeep, Manoj Disale, Shaikh Hassan from RCPD, and Payal Patel from Inali set out for Gandhidham. Concurrently, a seven-member team from Inali had departed early that morning via road. The entire contingent converged in Gandhidham on Saturday morning, and all requisite arrangements for the camp were promptly organized throughout the day. A handful of outstation beneficiaries were already present at that juncture and material necessary for the camp was unloaded from the van

The camp began at 7 am on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> February. Pre-registration procedures were promptly initiated and the event commenced with the rendition of the National Anthem. Anticipating approximately 50 to 60 fitments as per pre-camp registration, the overwhelming response from beneficiaries far surpassed expectations. The day concluded around 9 pm, yielding an exceptionally gratifying tally of 92 Hand Fitments. Notably, the team exhibited unwavering dedication, ensuring that no beneficiary was turned away.

The Rotary Club of Gandhidham extended exemplary hospitality throughout the camp. President Rohit Thacker, Secretary Jaswant Ahir, Project Coordinator Jaydevsinh Vaghela, Ravin Madaiyar alongside other Rotarians actively participated providing invaluable assistance to our team. The camp was hosted at the Rotary Bhawan, the dedicated premises of the Rotary Club of Gandhidham.

The Rotary Club's commendable initiatives include the operation of a Medical Service Center offering investigations at a nominal fee of Rs 50, supplemented by free medicine. Rotary Gandhidham has also been entrusted with 31 acres of land for the development of a 'Rotary Forest' alongside the ongoing construction of a 2.5-acre lake.

## Unveiling the Shri Bahri Malhotra Residential & Vocational Home for Girls

On the auspicious date of 8th January 2024, a momentous occasion graced the annals of the esteemed Rotary Club of Poona Downtown as the venerable Shri Ram Nath Kovind, Former President of India, ceremoniously inaugurated our most ambitious endeavour – the unveiling of the "SHRI BAHRI MALHOTRA RESIDENTIAL & VOCATIONAL HOME FOR GIRLS."



This monumental undertaking took root when our esteemed Past President, Rtn Ashwini Malhotra, pledged a generous sum of US\$ 250,000 in honour of Shri Bahri

Malhotra, thus cementing his status as an AKS member. Collaborating with The Janaseva Foundation, renowned for its tireless efforts in uplifting destitute and underprivileged girls, seemed a natural progression, given Shri Bahriji's close affiliation with their noble cause.



The donation, facilitated by Rtn Ashwini through his company Weikfield Foods Pvt Ltd as a CSR initiative, was earmarked exclusively for furnishing and equipping the home. Designed to accommodate 400 girls aged between 5 to 18 years, the overarching objective was to liberate these unfortunate souls from the harrowing grips of destitution, sparing them the indignity of begging or inhabiting squalid slums.

Ensuring a nurturing environment replete with proper nutrition, educational facilities in municipal schools, and vocational training tailored to their aspirations became the

cornerstone of this initiative. The vision was clear: by the time these girls reached adulthood, they would possess the skills and resilience necessary to navigate life's challenges, thereby breaking free from the vicious cycle of poverty.

The meticulous planning manifested in a meticulously furnished abode featuring 40 dormitories, each housing a maximum of 10 girls, along with ample amenities such as modern bathrooms, well-equipped study areas and solar panels providing both hot water and electricity. Security measures, recreational facilities, a fully functional kitchen and vocational training workshops rounded out the comprehensive infrastructure.



The ultimate goal was to imbue these girls with a sense of dignity and self-worth, ensuring that the comfort and cleanliness of their surroundings instilled a desire for a better future, free from the shackles of destitution. As the project nears its completion, with partial functionality already underway, the anticipation swells for its full-scale operation by June 2024, promising to transform the lives of 400 young girls and heralding a brighter tomorrow for generations to come.

Conflict often arises from extreme perceptions leading to complaints, criticism, and opposition. Ego can disrupt inner peace by tipping the balance between self-respect and arrogance. Effective communication involves patiently listening to others' viewpoints, fostering cooperation, mutual respect, and harmony.

Interrupting others and displaying hypersensitivity can escalate conflicts. Miss Patil highlighted the distinction between arguments,

which focus on who is right, and debates, which aim to determine what is right, with the former characterized by heat and noise and the latter by politeness and logic. Maturity entails maintaining composure, which facilitates conflict resolution and peace. Being unoffendable is considered a great virtue.
