Shekatkar, PVSM, AVSM, VSM (Retd), who will give us a talk on "Emerging World of 21st Century ,Role and Impact of India in the World Affairs"



LT GEN Dr. DB Shekatkar, PVSM, AVSM, VSM (RETD) a highly decorated officer who served the country in the 1965, 1971 and 1999 wars are one of those rare human beings in the same league as Field Marshal Douglas Macarthur, Sir Winston Churchill and our own Field Marshal SHFJ Manekshaw, who could wield the sword as well as the pen.

Amongst the many achievements in his distinguished career, the unique and probably most noteworthy one is being able to prevail upon a record number of terrorists in Kashmir (1267) trained in Afghanistan and Pakistan to give up terrorism and lead a normal life. This is a "record" probably in the world, after world II war where terrorists indoctrinated by "Religious Fundamentalism" gave up terrorism.

In addition to being a "man of action", he is also a "man of letters" having obtained a) B.Com. M.A. in Strategic Studies, M.Sc. and M.Phil. in Defence Studies, Ph.D. in Management Science, Post Graduate Diploma in Ecology and Environment, Post Graduate Diploma in Weapons and Equipment Management. He has completed another Ph.D. on Maoist/Naxalite violence and 3rd Ph.D. in "Psychological Warfare and Role of Media".

LT GEN Dr. DB Shekatkar is Chancellor of Central Sikkim University.

The venue for this enlightening session is Poona Club Conference Hall 1, with the program commencing at 6:30 p.m. The meeting will be followed by a Fellowship drinks and dinner, graciously hosted by Rtn. Shireesh and R'Ann Mukta Nadkar.

Installation of Maths Lab at Gramprabodhini School, Salumbre, Taluka Maval

Last July, we conducted an Eye Checkup Camp at this rural school, where 450 students from nearby villages study, from Class V to Class XII. During the Camp, the Principal and Mathematics Teacher informed us that the students parents are mostly farmers or Brick-kiln workers, and are themselves not in a position to teach their children even basic maths at home. Thus the students were very weak in this subject. They requested for help to set up a Maths Lab.

A maths lab is a place where students and teachers work together to help students understand math concepts, practice skills, and develop study skills. It can also be a place for students to work with each other on similar material, and for teachers to provide one-on-one tutoring.

Maths lab contains games, puzzles, and other materials that students can use to explore mathematics, learn, and develop an interest in the subject. The activities appeal to a wide range of students, including those of different ages and mathematical proficiency.

We were fortunate that Rtn. Giri Sakhrani agreed to donate Rs 2,50,000/-for the project, which adequately covered the requirement of funds. The Maths lab has been developed by Mr. Rahul Kokil, Director of Manthan, an education development organisation. He has taught at Dnyan Prabhodini for 12 years and specialized in Mathematics and other subjects.

The Lab was inaugurated by Rtn Giri Sakhrani and yours truly on 16 April 2024. The Children who have been trained for two days were able to explain effectively the Number Line concept and the Pythagoras theorem. The Teachers and the Principal expressed their gratitude and assured us that with this addition, they will show better results in Mathematics.
