

From the President's desk



It seems a long gap since our last meeting, but though it wasn't a formal meeting, did get to meet a fairly large number of members and R'Anns at the 'Music for Charity' Concert – RCPC Rocks II, on the 16th of March. As promised, it was an evening of enthralling music, and had the large audience tapping their feet and/or clapping their hands to the beat. Huge congratulations to Rtn Vipen, who saw it through, from conception to execution! The musicians were at their best, and could have gone on longer, if we didn't have time constraints. A big thank you to all those who attended and encouraged the artistes, and the organizers, with their wholehearted appreciation.

Hat's off to our tireless and timeless couple Rtn. Oni and R'Ann Nafisa, for their extraordinary dedication. They have conducted about 25 camps this Rotary year, and the total no. of eye checkups is nearing the 15K mark. It is not that only the numbers are impressive, but what is amazing is that they have through these camps identified close to 300 children who need further examination and/or glasses. But for these camps, these children's ailments would have gone unnoticed, and resulted in more serious afflictions. The children examined at these camps would never under normal circumstances be taken to an ophthalmologist by their parents, and hence the importance of such eye camps.

We received good news in the form of a huge donation from the Desai Brothers CSR, thanks mainly to our own Rtn. Nitin Desai. The donation of Rs 3 Crores, along with the money donated by our club members and some money from other Clubs, has ensured that we will be able to achieve the target of 15,000 cataract surgeries this year. This Gift of Sight Project, though a District Project, is spearheaded by RCPC, and Rtn. PP Ravi Kapoor, who has done a lot of leg work towards making this happen. We are very thankful to Rtn. Nitin Desai and Rtn. PP Ravi for their support.

The other major project that has been approved is the 'Gift of Life Project, where we, along with partner clubs from overseas have raised funds for 50 Pediatric Heart Surgeries, thus meeting our target fully. This project has been approved as a Global Grant Project, and will go a long way in saving the lives of 50 children suffering from Congenital Heart Disease (CHD). Here too, Rtn PP Ravi Kapoor has done a lot of work and needs to be lauded.

Work on the Dam Repair Project in Satara District is in full swing, and we look forward to seeing it being completed by the middle of April. I know it is getting warmer by the day, and the day temperatures are likely to be around the 40C mark, but still would like everyone to actually see what is happening on the ground. Rtn Giri, who is passionate about water conservation, is organizing a trip to the Dam Site around the second week of April, and I earnestly request members to join us for this trip. I can assure you that you will come back tired but fulfilled.

We have also received Rs. 12.5L as CSR Funds from a company called 3A Composite Pvt Ltd., in Mumbai, towards funding a Chemistry Lab at the New Vision College in Takli Haji, Shirur Taluka. The CEO of this Company is Mr. Ranjeet Sharma, who incidentally is the son-in-law of Rtn. PP Rakesh Bhargava. So there is no doubt about who deserves to be congratulated for making this happen. Thank you very much Rtn. PP Rakesh and Ranjeet for your kind support.

The District has organized Vocational Awards zone wise this year, and asked for nominations from Clubs. From our Club, we have nominated Mrs Jai Khamkar, the President of Maalganga Andh Apang Sanstha (MAAS). That is the organization that has started and runs the New Vision Residential College at Takli Haji, Shirur Taluka. The Award will be presented at a glittering function on Saturday, 30 March 2024, at the MCCIA Auditorium.

The Inner Wheel Club of Pune Central, our partner club, is organizing the Ladies' Night, this week, and it promises to be an evening full of fun and entertainment. They are also sponsoring the Wine, and we will follow it up with a sumptuous dinner fellowship, where the menu has been carefully crafted by our Fellowship Chair – Rtn. PP Sukhi Kalra. Eye Check-up camps

I am pleased to provide you with an update on the recent eye check-up camps held in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Baner and other esteemed partners.

On Wednesday, March 20th, we organized a significant camp at the National Chemical Laboratory PES Modern High School in Pashan. This camp was made possible through the joint efforts of the Rotary Club of Pune Central, the Rotary Club of Baner, and their Rotaract and Interact clubs. I extend my heartfelt gratitude to Dr. Ravi Kumar (retired), Director of NCL, and a Rotarian from RC of Poona Downtown for their invaluable support. Our sincere thanks go out to Ravi for his unwavering assistance throughout the camp. Despite the challenges, including the late hour, we successfully screened a total of 550 students and 40 staff members. Additionally, 53 students received glasses, 23 were referred to clinics, and 16 received reading glasses. I want to express my deepest appreciation to Apoorva and her dedicated team, along with Pranjal from the Community Eye Care Foundation, whose tireless efforts ensured the camp's success.

Subsequently, on Tuesday, March 26th, we conducted another eye check-up camp in collaboration with the Rotary Club of Baner at Punruthan Samarsata Gurukulam in Keshavnagar, Chinchwad, Pune. Despite expecting 300 students and staff, we encountered fewer attendees. Nevertheless, the team from the Community Eye Care Foundation, under the leadership of Apoorva and Pranjal, worked diligently under challenging circumstances. I extend my sincere thanks to CECF for their dedication. During this camp, we screened 150 students, referred 13 to clinics, and provided refractive glasses to one student and one staff member.

These camps have been instrumental in providing much-needed eye care to communities in need. We deeply missed Nafisa's presence during these fulfilling endeavors.



Evolution of Rotary in India

J. Coombes, the manager of steel products company in Calcutta was on a business trip in U.S.A. There he got interested in the Rotary movement and was impressed with the 'Friendship, Fellowship, Service'. After his return to India in 1919, he organized a Rotary Club in Calcutta. The first meeting was held on 26th September 1919, and the Club was granted charter on January 1, 1920, in 1921 S. C Rudra was admitted as the first active Indian member with the classification 'Mining Engineering'. In 1926 an Indian Honorary Secretary was elected in the person of Nitish C. Lahiry. Finally, an Indian, A.F.M. Abdul Ali, was elected as President, the first Indian to head a Rotary Club anywhere.

The Rotary Club of Bombay, launched by Jim Davison, was added on 19th March 1929 with charter strength of 38 members of whom 37 were Non-Indians; and the one and the only Indian was Sir Phiroze Sethna, a member of Indian Legislature, who later became the District Governor. Jim organized a pleasant group of 28 at Maiden's Hotel Delhi on 26th April 1929. R.T.H. Meckenzie, Manager of the Burmah Shell Oil Company Ltd, a Britisher, was elected as President. Even before the club got under way, members began leaving town. With departures on long leave the Membership dwindled to half and finally the club had to be closed down in 1931.

In Madras, Jim Davidson, with the help of F.C. James of the United Paltrers Association of South India organized a meeting on May 10, 1929 with 30 Charter members, all Non-Indians. The first President was C.G. Armstrong, Chairman of the Madras Port Trust; and the first Secretary was Morton Chance, Manager of a hotel in Madras.

The growth has been slow, perhaps due to the reason that India at that time was based essentially on agricultural economy while the whole framework of Rotary membership was based upon industrial and professional structure of society. Gradually as India emerged to an economy issued on modern industrialization, extension of Rotary became possible.

Rotary club of Amritsar was born in 1933 and that of Bangalore in 1934. In 1935 five clubs were formed: Ahmedabad, Baroda, Jamshedpur, Poona and Sholapur, all fast developing Industrial centres producing textiles, chemicals and iron and steel. Three clubs namely Cochin, Lucknow and Surat were established in 1937.

Rotary Club of Cochin, then the only club in Kerala, was chartered on 23rd August 1937. Of the 22 chartered members, 10 were Non-Indians. Another three Clubs – Asansol, Madurai and Rajkot came into existence in 1938, and Agra, Salem and Jubulpore.in 1939.

Delhi Club was also revived in 1939. After the World War II and India's Independence in 1947, the real Indianisation of Rotary started. By the end of Rotary Year 1946-47, there were 71 Clubs (14 in Gujarat, 10 in Maharashtra, 10 in U.P, 7 in Tamil Nadu, 7 in Karnataka and 23 in other States) with a total membership of 3121 in 7 Districts as against 3 Clubs (with 235 members in 1929-30 in one provisional district, the District comprising of India, Burma and Ceylon)
