


### **PROGRAM OF THE DAY - A.G.M.**

## **PROGRAM OF SCALE GRANT**

The Prized US\$ 2 million PROGRAM OF SCALE GRANT was awarded to 'Partners for Water Access and Better Harvests in India' to improve livelihoods of 60,000 farmers across four Indian States. The Award will help sustainable agriculture and water management practices and support Rotary Members' work with farmers affected by climate change. Foundation Trustee Chair Barry Rassin announced the grant at the Singapore Convention held from 25-29<sup>th</sup> May 2024.



This program will aim to increase groundwater tables, extend cultivation areas

and raise incomes of nearly 60,000 farmers by up to 30%. Indian farmers are responsible for producing much of rice, wheat and other food staples. But the groundwater is fast vanishing. Climate change is making rainfall erratic leading to conditions of drought. Bary said "we are working with Indian farmers on a five year program to plant seeds for sustainable farming in India for generations to come."

'Partners for Water Access and Better Harvests in India' will build rainwater collection systems such as check-dams and ponds to increase groundwater collection by 10-15% each year. It will reduce soil erosion on 4,100 hectares of land by introducing drip irrigation and by planting native species and fruit trees.

The Rotary Foundation Award is given to evidence-based sustainable, successful programs that target at least one of the seven focus areas of the Foundation. The Programs are sponsored by Rotary Members in collaboration with local communities and partners that offer additional expertise and support.

**The Rotary Health Communities Challenge** was launched by Rotary International in Partnership with Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and World Vision. The Program was formally announced in the Singapore Convention. This US\$30 million program addresses some of the deadliest child diseases in four African countries: Congo, Mozambique, Nigeria & Zambia. Dy Director of Gates Foundation's Program Advocacy and Communications Obinna Onyekwena presented the program along with a video address by Bill Gates at the Singapore Convention.
