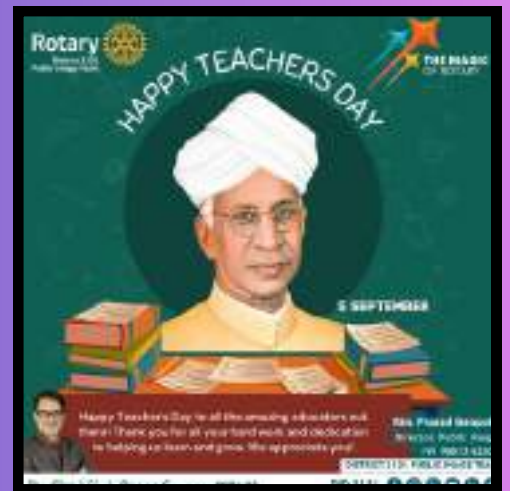

Additionally, Mrs. Preeta Karkhanis, the principal of Konkan Education Society, was also honored for her 35 years of exemplary service in teaching. She has made a lasting impact on the minds of her students, and her contribution was recognized with a shawl, a coconut, and a trophy.

September 21 marked a beautiful coincidence of World Peace Day and Sankashti Chaturthi. This year, the Rotary Club of Pen initiated a program of Atharvashirsha recitation, and this was its third phase. It was a particularly special occasion this year. The Rotary Club of Pen members gathered at the Ganapati temple in Devaali and participated in the Atharvashirsha recitation with deep devotion.



Back in 1905, an engraver and Chicago Rotarian, Montague Bear, designed a simple Rotary wagon wheel, showing movement and dust. It was meant to represent civilization, movement and service work in action. Over time, many Rotary clubs adopted the wheel in one form or another.

In 1922 it was decided to create and develop an official Rotary emblem and in 1923 a gear with 24 teeth and six spokes was officially adopted. To me, the gear teeth around the outside represent the fact that work is to be done.

The six spokes represent the inner ROTARY CLUe direction and path of our Vocational Service, through the 1905 representation of our membership NATION via the classification system.

HUTATMA DIN

(25th September 2024)



On September 25, the Ankur Adivasi Trust celebrated Hutatma Din with great enthusiasm, honoring Adivasi martyr Nagya Mahadu Katkari, who participated in the glorious and heroic battle of 1930. The Ankur Adivasi Trust organized a grand rally of Adivasi brothers and sisters from Raigad Bazaar in Pen to Shivaji Chowk, ending at the Mahatma Gandhi Library. Afterward, a ceremony took place at the Mahatma Gandhi Library, where dignitaries performed a ritual in front of a portrait of Hutatma Nagya Mahadu Katkari, followed by speeches. The Adivasi sisters presented an exceptional cultural program featuring their traditional dances. Approximately 800 Adivasi brothers and sisters attended the event.

The Rotary Club of Pen provided water, refreshments, and snacks to all the Adivasi attendees, and distributed gifts to the 100 sisters who participated in the dance. Nagya Mahadu Katkari, a brave Adivasi martyr, played a key role in the Chirner Forest Satyagraha, a significant movement for India's independence. On September 25, eight brave heroes from the Chirner area in Uran Taluka risked their lives to fight against the oppressive British rule, and Nagya Katkari played a crucial role in this battle, striking fear into the British authorities. President of the Rotary Club of Pen, Sanyogita Temghare, expressed her pride in being part of this event, highlighting the legacy of these brave warriors.

The event was attended by Ankur Adivasi Trust director Mrs. Vaishalитай Patil, Mr. Nitin Patil (I.A.S, Secretary, Human Rights Commission), President of the Mahatma Gandhi Library Mr. Arvind Wange, and members of the Rotary Club were present.
